Attendance We encourage students to come to school every day. To ensure that attendance changes are communicated to our office and teachers, **you must call the school to report all absences and/or tardies at 703-361-3444.** Parents of students who are absent will receive an automated call to verify the student's absence and to ensure they are safe. **After four unexcused absences,** parents are required to meet with the Administration and School Counselor for an attendance conference. Excessive tardies will also be subject to an inquiry and possibly a meeting. **After ten excused absences, additional absences will not be excused without a doctor's note.**

required to fill out additional forms (withdrawal or transfer forms).
